Early Childhood Poverty and Later Attainment

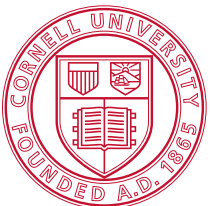

Most poor children achieve less, exhibit more problem behaviors and are less healthy than children reared in more affluent families. Dr. Duncan assesses the causal impact of early childhood poverty on later adult outcomes including earnings, work hours, arrests, and health status. The 3rd Bronfenbrenner Lecture commemorates the achievements and contributions of Urie Bronfenbrenner, co-founder of the national Head Start program and widely regarded as one of the world's leading scholars in developmental psychology and human ecology.
